# Chapel Services

*All members of the College and University, and of the wider public, are most welcome at all chapel services.*

## **SUNDAY SUNG EUCHARIST**, 11am in the Tunstall Chapel

The service is usually according to the Church of England's Common Worship Order One. The choir sings for most services, which also include a sermon and congregational hymns. The service is followed by drinks on the Tunstall Gallery.

## **TUESDAY COMPLINE**, 9pm in the Norman Chapel

Compline is the ancient monastic service of night prayer, and is short, reflective, and candlelit. The service alternates between choral compline (sung by the Compline Choir) and a said service which often includes a short meditation.

## **THURSDAY CHORAL EVENSONG**, 6pm in the Tunstall Chapel

This sung Evening Prayer service is found in the Book of Common Prayer. The Chapel Choir sings many of the parts of the service, and there is a sermon, usually given by a guest preacher, and often forming part of a themed series. Evensong finishes in time for Formal Dinner at 7pm.

**MORNING PRAYER** is usually said Monday – Thursday at 9am in the Tunstall Chapel. Anyone is welcome to join Hannah for this.

The chapel **DISCUSSION GROUP** meets on Sundays over coffee after lunch, beginning on 16<sup>th</sup> October.

**COLLEGE CHRISTIAN UNION** usually meets in the Norman Chapel on Friday evenings. For more information contact the CU reps (Naomi Brehm and Isabelle Heath).

The **CATHSOC** rep in Castle this year is Carmen Bowes.

The **UNIVERSITY TAIZÉ SERVICE** takes place in the Norman Chapel at 9pm on Mondays. For more information, contact John Morris.

University College has two chapels: the eleventh century Norman Chapel at the foot of the Norman Gallery stairs, and the larger Tunstall Chapel, dating from 1540, which can be reached via the courtyard clock tower stairs. They are your chapels, and you are welcome to use either for private prayer or reflection, or quiet reading. If they are locked, the key is available from the Porters.

The chapels may also sometimes be used for concerts, plays or meetings with the Chaplain's permission.
